Greetings Nobles

This year has really flown by, and the warm summer has moved in, and I am sure we will be glad to experience some cooler weather.

** At the 2023 Imperial Session a bylaws proposal was passed that increases our annual Per Capita \$20. The current annual Per Capita is \$30. This means that if you pay the annual Per Capita your 2024 dues will be \$20 higher. All Per capita collected is money that goes directly to Shriners International. This was necessary because of Shriners International's lower membership and increased operation cost.

** Your Divan highly suggests that you consider prepaying your Per Capita for life. The current cost is \$30 times 30. That's a total of \$900.00.

** You can also prepay your Hospital Assessment. That would be \$5 times 30. That's a total of \$150.00.

** By prepaying one, or both of these, you never have to pay any future increases.

** You can pay either, or both of these, in one check or by making payments.

If you choose to make payments, you set your own payment amount and frequency.

YOUR PAYMENTS MUST BE COMPLETED BY DECEMBER 31, 2023.

** Also, do not pay your 2024 dues until your payment plan is complete.

** If you have any questions, or wish to prepay either of these, contact me to help you set it up.

Nobles, I ask each of you to please purchase, and sell, our Sportsman's Raffle tickets. There are great prizes and fun to be had at this event on October 15th. So....Sell, sell, sell.

Also, Nobles, if you know any member who hasn't paid his dues for 2023 talk to him about paying now. 116 Nobles have not paid those dues. The Temple has dues outstanding that the total due is over \$22,000.00 as of August 2, 2023. Khedive Shrine Temple needs your participation in our events, and we all know that if you come out you will have fun and enjoy the festivities.

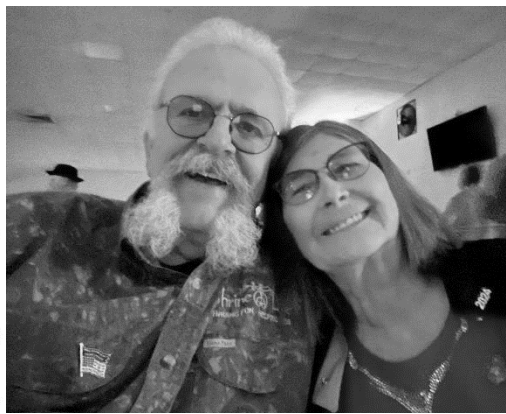

MEET GIANNA AND JUAN DIEGO



Every year, Shriners Children's™ selects a pair of International Patient Ambassadors to represent the healthcare system's patients. The ambassadors share their stories of perseverance and the ways Shriners Children's has made a difference in their lives. We are honored to have these impressive young people advocating for our healthcare system.

GIANNA

Gianna, 15, was born with a rare condition called proximal femoral focal deficiency (PFFD), which caused her to be missing part of her left femur. Her parents knew they had to find the right specialized care for their daughter, and were grateful to learn that the orthopedic team at Shriners Children's Southern California had the expertise to treat PFFD.

Gianna's left leg was shorter than her right one, and she faced hip malformations and other congenital left extremity limb deficiencies, said Robert Cho, M.D., pediatric orthopedic surgeon and chief of staff at Shriners Children's Southern California. "Gianna did not have a functional knee joint, and she had a non-functioning foot that was pointed inward. It would have been essentially impossible for her to walk without amputating that and giving her a prosthesis," Dr. Cho said.

Gianna had her first visit at Shriners Children's when she was 3 months old, and at 9 months, she received her first prosthesis.

As Gianna grew older she became aware of her physical differences and at times struggled with her self-image. With the unwavering love and support of her family and her care team at Shriners Children's, she developed

the confidence to embrace life. The prosthetics and rehabilitation teams worked with Gianna to teach her how to adapt and build the skills to meet her physical challenges.

"My Shriners Children's family taught me to never let my leg hold me back from being the best version of myself," she said.

Now Gianna is an active high school student who is both an artist and an athlete. She is an avid sports fan and keeps busy by competing in tennis and golf. She especially loves football, and her favorite team is the Kansas City Chiefs. Her dream is to be the commissioner of the NFL someday. With her drive and spirit, Dr. Cho has every confidence that Gianna can achieve what she sets her mind to.

Gianna's father was so impressed with the care his daughter received he was inspired to become a Shriner and currently serves as chairman of the Board of Governors at Shriners Children's Southern California. "I'm so proud of my dad. I'm glad that he has found a brotherhood and a community. Just as I have found support, he has, as well," said Gianna.

"Shriners Children's was there for me when I needed them," said Gianna. "I wouldn't be where I am today without them. Being an International Patient Ambassador gives me the opportunity to show my gratitude for Shriners Children's. I want to inspire and encourage kids just like me and let them know that the limits are endless. All they have to do is try!"

JUAN DIEGO

Juan Diego, 18, was burned in an electrical accident when he was 13, leaving his hands seriously disfigured. He spent more than a month in the hospital in Honduras. When he returned home, he was completely dependent on others for even the most basic tasks. He could not take care of himself, go to school, or draw or play music, two of his passions.

The Ruth Paz Foundation, a non-profit organization in Honduras devoted to providing quality medical services to children, learned about Juan Diego's burn injury and connected him with Shriners Children's Boston. Four months after his injury, he arrived at the hospital in Boston. Some of his burn wounds were still open, requiring immediate attention from the acute burn team. Juan Diego knew the road ahead was going to be challenging, but he approached every day, every treatment and every obstacle with a positive attitude.

During his two and a half months in Boston in 2018, much of Juan Diego's treatment involved intensive physical and occupational therapy. He worked with therapists at least five days a week, sometimes multiple times a day. Occupational therapist Courtney Updegrove fabricated customized splints for his hands, enabling Juan Diego to relearn how to care for himself. He was even able to draw and play the drums again.

Along with his traditional therapy sessions, Juan Diego was a member of Team Brave, the hospital's community reintegration program and competed in a Spartan Race as part of Team No Limits. He was also one of five patients who attended Game 1 of the World Series. He says it is a night he will never forget.



Juan Diego transferred to the reconstructive phase of his care where Joseph Upton, M.D., a plastic surgeon hand specialist, was able to restore sensation and mobility by taking tissue from another part of Juan Diego's body and building a web space between his thumb and index finger. Juan Diego continues to come to Shriners Children's Boston for reconstructive and laser surgeries to improve the function and mobility of his hands.

With every improvement, Juan Diego is able to do more of what he loves. From art and music to so many sports - soccer, football, tennis and ping-pong, Juan Diego keeps very busy. He would even love to go to the Paralympics to compete in ping-pong someday. "I should probably start practicing!" he laughed.

Now a college student in Honduras studying international relations, Juan Diego is honored to represent Shriners Children's as an international patient ambassador.

"I want to put into action all of the gratitude I have for Shriners Children's and those who have helped me since my injury," he said. "I hope my story brings inspiration and hope to others."

VIRGINIANS GIVING BACK - ON HER FEET

The surgery fixed Gabby Bryan's feet and ankles, and it also did wonders for her smile. The 9-year-old child from Jamaica, born with spina bifida, came to the United States last fall for surgery to repair the feet and ankles left misshapen by years of crawling. She had never walked. It has been a slow, arduous process, but the operation worked: Gabby is on her feet, with the help of leg braces and a walker, and she has an entirely new outlook on life. Gabby Bryan celebrates her ninth birthday in March after returning home to Jamaica following surgery.

Her mother, Novie McKenzie, said in an interview from her family's rural area of Jamaica that Gabby has smiled more and been more talkative since returning home in February. Her personality has brightened from the shy child who had to sit and watch the world go by with no way to keep up. "Yes, she's happy," McKenzie said in a WhatsApp video call earlier this month while chickens squawked in the background. "She can move around ... and do things for herself." Sue Miles dances with Gabby outside Gabby's home in Jamaica in March after the child returned home following surgery in the United States that allows her to walk with braces and a walker. Though Gabby is a long way from running and playing or even walking without the aid of braces or a walker, it has been a remarkable transformation for a young girl growing up in poverty who couldn't even attend school for the longest time.

The series of events that led to this dramatic shift in her life were set in motion by sheer happenstance. Sue Miles, a retired school counselor from Buckingham County who splits her time between Virginia and Jamaica, was on the Caribbean island in January 2020, walking to volunteer at a high school, when she stopped to say "Good morning!" to a woman selling candy, cookies and soft drinks on the side of the road. Gabby beams as she recuperates from surgery with a host family living near Greenville, South Carolina. As she walked over, Miles noticed a little girl dressed in denim overalls sitting in a wooden chair behind the woman. Gabby had big eyes, Miles recalls, but was quiet and subdued. Miles asked why the girl wasn't in school, and the woman — the child's grandmother — explained she was not allowed to attend school because of her physical disability.

From that moment, Miles, described as "tenacious" by more than one friend, was on the case.

I wrote about Miles and Gabby in December 2021, a story that outlined how Miles, a former Peace Corps volunteer in Jamaica who came to love the place, had made it her mission to find a way for Gabby to attend school, which she did with the help of an aide. Miles raised money and made friends, securing a wheelchair for Gabby, leg braces and therapy. She advocated for Gabby with physicians, driving her hours to Kingston for appointments, and learned the only way she would ever walk would be to undergo surgery unavailable to her in Jamaica. So, Miles started working on that.

There was an incredible tangle of bureaucratic red tape and paperwork Miles had to persevere through, but she did and this is the result: Miles flew with Gabby to the United States in October, making a brief stopover in Buckingham and then driving her to South Carolina, where she would undergo surgery at Shriners Children's Greenville, a hospital that provides specialty medical care to children, regardless of their ability to pay, which Gabby couldn't. The logistics of the trip were made possible by Childspring International, an Atlanta-based nonprofit whose mission is to make life-changing surgeries available for children from developing countries. Childspring International took care of Gabby's medical visa, covered her airfare and arranged for her to stay with a family near Greenville for several months, before and after surgery. The Baxley family, which includes a daughter Gabby's age, was amazing, Miles said. After her surgery in November, Gabby recuperated, with casts on both legs, at the home of the Baxleys in South Carolina. "When I walked into the Baxleys' home with Gabby on my hip, I almost started crying," Miles said. "I knew as soon as I walked in that Gabby was in the most wonderful place. It's hard to explain ... but it was a warm, inviting, loving home, and I knew Gabby was going to be OK. "And she was." Besides getting Gabby to all of her therapy sessions (and even dental visits) and welcoming her into their family celebrations of Thanksgiving and Christmas, the Baxleys arranged tutoring for Gabby, introduced her to "Mister Rogers' Neighborhood" and the world of Barbies, and kept in touch with Gabby's mother back in Jamaica, calling her almost every day to let her know how Gabby was doing. "They take the best care of her," McKenzie said, in appreciation, "and they love her."

Miles, too, is grateful for the Baxleys and for all who have helped Gabby: the Shriners, Childspring International, her friends and family in Buckingham who were the first to donate money to assist Gabby, the stranger who contacted her after reading the earlier story and gave her a check that led to the construction of a 250-foot-long cement walkway to Gabby's home on a steep, rocky hillside. Gabby cannot walk much of it on her own yet — her current braces lock at the knee, to give her stability, and she's still learning the mechanics of walking — but maybe one day.

Gabby must still wear leg braces and use a walker to get around. Limited as she might be, she can do so many more things than she could before. She can dress herself, her mother said, and move around their home. She can climb into bed with the help of a wooden bench that allows her to reach the tall bed. Upon her return to school, her classmates gathered and applauded for her as she walked past them — they had never seen her walk — to her class.

Little steps. Big strides.

Gabby will outgrow the leg braces she now uses, but when she needs new ones, the Shriners will provide them at no charge until she is 18, flying Gabby and her mother to the United States and arranging lodging for as long as needed for fittings and everything else.

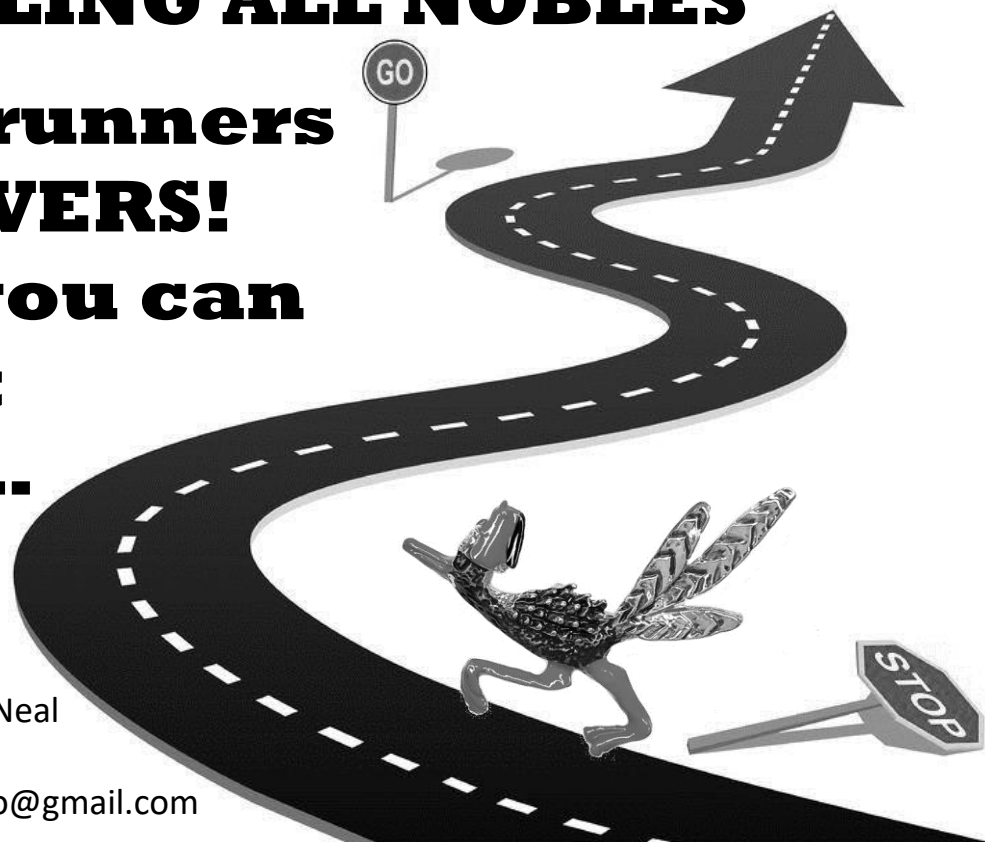
